The Summer Camp Registration Guide

The following are suggestions for registering campers for this year's Camps. We hope these will be helpful as you prepare for this faith experience for your youth.

1. Choose someone to serve as the **Summer Camp registration chairperson and registrar** for your congregation. Give them this packet and the ministry of advertising, recruiting, and registering all the young people in your congregation for camp. Be aware and point out to parents that the registration form takes some time to complete and includes a health statement signed by the camper's doctor or nurse, a copy of the camper's vaccination record, and a signature by the camper's pastor. Encourage them to start early!
2. Read through all of the information and registrations in this packet. If you have questions, contact Shelly Garrison at 719-201-3419 or skgarrison50@gmail.com – or our camp admin assistant Patty Fadum at 719-685-6537 or villageccoffice@gmail.com
3. Make copies of the publicity posters and hang them up in as many places as possible. (Youth, Children and Adult Sunday School Classes; entrances and exits near the sanctuary; youth rooms; fellowship areas)
4. Publicize dates, costs, and theme in your newsletters and bulletins for several weeks. Also set and include YOUR registration due date, so that you have time to organize, check, and mail the forms and payment early enough to arrive by April 25. Use the bulletin inserts enclosed in this packet. Include reminders to make their doctor's appointments now. All health forms need to be completed and included with the registration packet by the deadline or the registration is incomplete.
5. Send registration information to all the children and youth currently in 1st – 12th grade from your congregation. Include in that information the date for them to turn in the paper portion of their forms and fees (*checks written to your church*) to you, their summer camp registrar in their local congregation. The forms must be returned in the same format as they appear on the hard copy included in this mailing to you. Any changes to the CRMR Camp forms will not be accepted.
6. It is helpful to have a Camp Sunday one day during church. Have a booth set up with camp info; old camp pictures; people who have been to camp; and the registrar to take camp forms and fees. You might also have camp announcements and information as a part of the service.
7. You may request one of our regional Camp Ambassadors to visit your church and share their presentation, complete with lots of pics and tons of info, with your congregation. Contact Shelly at skgarrison50@gmail.com to schedule a visit.
8. Your registrar should **proof all of your campers' forms** to check for all needed signatures, health information, insurance policy and numbers, immunization record, etc. Make sure all the blanks are filled in with the needed information. **Campers are not fully registered until their form is complete.**

9. Fill out a remittance form and send it along with **one check for the full amount** made payable to the Central Rocky Mountain Region. You should fill out a remittance form for each camp (Discovery, Jr, Chi Rho and CYF) that you are sending campers to. **We prefer not to receive personal checks from individuals.**
10. Please send your completed forms, remittance sheet and total check from the congregation as soon as possible to avoid any late fees and to guarantee each of your campers a spot. Camp forms count when all information, signatures, and moneys have been received.

11. Summer campers will receive a confirmation (either by email or regular mail, whichever they indicate they prefer) when the complete registration and full payment is received. This is to let them know that they are confirmed and have a space at camp. A complete letter of what to bring and more details about their camp will come from the specific camp directors closer to the time of the event.
12. The other way people can support camp is by making sure that all our youth can attend. We have a Campership fund that churches/individuals can donate to in order to provide scholarships so that no child/youth misses camp for financial reasons. **Please distribute the letter explaining the Campership ministry to your congregation. For some families, especially those sending multiple children, camp is expensive, and this is a way that your members without kids can help make camp available for every boy and girl.**
13. **FYI:** Discovery Camp. Discovery Camp was begun to help ease the transition for small children to be away from home. **A child may only attend Discovery Camp twice.** 3rd graders who have already attended Discovery Camp twice no longer qualify and must register for Junior Camp.

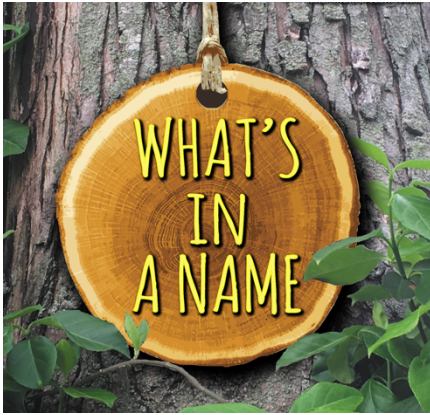

Camp Curriculum 2024

Day 1: Name Dropping

Campers will consider how the presence of spirit makes a place holy, examine ways God has been faithful through generations, ponder how the act of naming reflects a deeper knowing, and be assured that God knows us by name. (Exodus 3:1-15)

Day 2: Name Calling

Campers will understand that Jesus understands beyond assumptions and divisions, identify how our personal labels create limits, identify their power to transcend labels, and covenant to move beyond labels and practice acceptance. (Luke 19:1-10)

Day 3: Given Name

Campers will explore the expectations placed on them, identify ways they are pressured to follow the crowd, learn that challenging norms can be liberating, and see the ways God is nurturing something new in them. (Luke 1:57-66)

Day 4: That's Not My Name

Campers will discover people in the Bible named difficult feelings, be empowered to claim their own identity, be encouraged to respect the experiences of others, and consider faith may not lead to easy answers. (Ruth 1)

Day 5: Name Tag

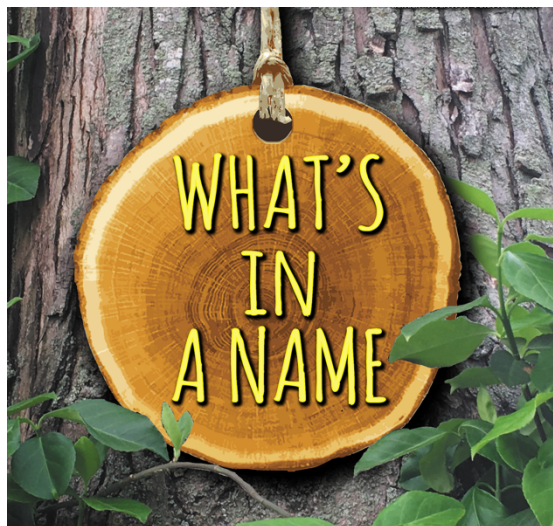
Campers will consider how pivotal moments can change their identity, explore how a spiritual encounter can reroute one's path, acknowledge moments that have forever changed us, and examine how we mark important moments. (Genesis 32:22-31)

Day 6: What's in a Name

Campers will recognize names can be a reminder of their potential, realize potential is not always immediately fulfilled, embrace failure as part of their story, and be empowered to live into their story. (Matthew 16:13-18)

Day 7: More Than a Name

Campers will recognize that identity lies more in who you are than what you're named, and know encountering the holy cannot be limited by words. (Exodus 3:1-15)

Central Rocky Mountain Campership Ministry

Dear Friends of CRMR Camps,

One of the strongest ministries of the *Christian Church (Disciples of Christ)* is its camping and retreats program for children and youth. People of faith often look back at camp as a time of significant faith transformation or growth; a moment where their relationship with God was strengthened; or when a call to ministry was heard or accepted. Faith experiences out in nature bring about a special connection with our Creator.

Our region has a strong commitment to making our camp ministries strong and meaningful for all our young people. To be fiscally responsible and to live as good stewards of our resources, our camper fees cover the cost of the campers' lodging and meals at La Foret, the cost of training, lodging and food for the adult volunteers, and \$20 per camper for supplies.

Many of our youth have jobs to pay for camp; many families have more than one child to consider; and many churches pay a percentage of the fees for the campers from their congregation. Even with all of that, there are always some who need additional assistance.

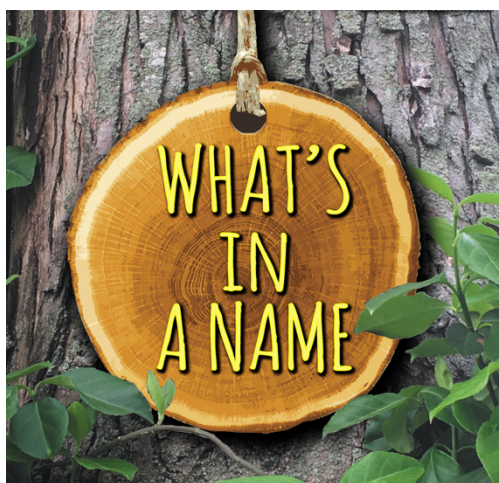

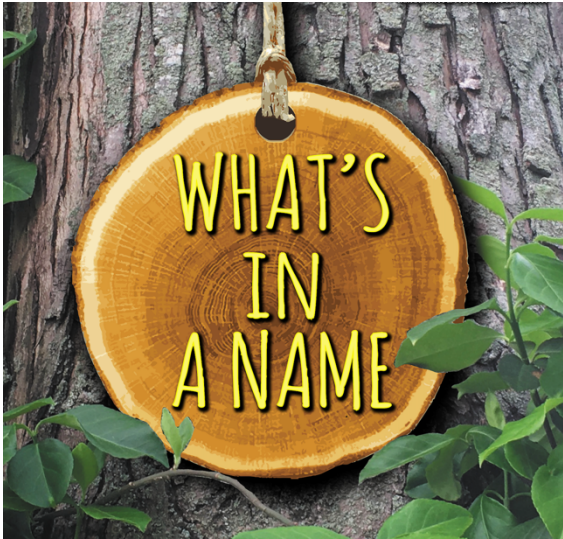

CRMR 2024 Summer Camps Registration Instructions

Due: April 25

Don't be late – start your registration process now!

Step 1 – call your healthcare provider & schedule your exam before the deadline.

Step 2 – find out who is handling the registrations for your church (your registrar is probably your youth minister or secretary/admin assistant) and get a copy of the registration form from them, or by emailing your request to Shelly at skgarrison50@gmail.com

Step 3 - Work with your parents, healthcare provider, pastor, and registrar to get your pages completely filled out. Note that you also need to include a copy of your insurance card and your immunization record.

Step 4 – Give your completed registration form and payment* to your church registrar early and encourage all the other campers from your church to also!

* Your check should be made out to your church. You pay your church, then they pay the region with one check for all your church's campers. Some churches even pay for up to ½ of their campers' fees!

PLEASE DO NOT DROP OFF CAMPERS EARLY.

It is La Foret's policy that no youth may be on the premises until check in begins, see above for check-in times. The camp staff will not assume responsibility or liability for any youth until they have officially checked into the camp. Also, please be prompt in arriving to pick up campers on the last day of camp.

2024 DROP OFF AND PICK UP PROCEDURES

Junior, Chi Rho, and CYF camp check-in will be at Inglis Hall. After completing check-in, drive your camper(s) to their cabin to unload and meet their cabin counselors and mates. Only campers and counselors should enter the cabins. Discovery campers will check in at the Ponderosa lodge on the 20th, and following check in will remain there while their parents drop their luggage off at their cabin.

For pick up on Saturday, please drive directly to your camper's **cabin** and **wait in your vehicle** for him/her. One of the cabin counselors will have a sign out sheet for you to sign before leaving with your camper.

MEDICATIONS:

All medications, including vitamins, cough drops, etc., should be packed separately, IN THEIR ORIGINAL CONTAINER. The container shall be clearly labeled with the camper's name and turned in to the camp health staff during check in.

SPECIAL HEALTH NOTE:

Please do not send your child/youth to camp with any of the following symptoms:

- Undiagnosed rash, sore or other skin condition
- Sore throat
- Coughing
- Diarrhea or vomiting
- Fever
- Any Covid or other contagious disease or symptoms

INSURANCE:

Both La Foret Camp and the Christian Church (DOC) Central Rocky Mountain Region, carry “excess insurance” to cover accidents, *not illness*, for those attending camp. “Excess Insurance” means that any costs which are not covered by personal insurance plans on the camper will be covered by the La Foret and/or CRMR policies. You will provide the information we need about your family medical insurance on page 5 of the registration form, along with a **copy of the camper’s insurance card**. We must have this information, and this will be the information we use, in case we need to take your child / youth for emergency medical care. Any bill which you receive for emergency medical care while at camp, over and above what is covered by your insurance, should be submitted for payment to the CRMR.

SUPERVISION AND PARTICIPATION:

Campers are under the supervision of a cabin or group counselor and the directors of the camp and are expected to abide by the rules and covenant of the camp at all times. Campers are expected to participate in all camp activities unless specifically excused by a doctor or parent in writing (page 5 of registration form). The ultimate result of non-cooperation and / or consistent behavioral problems will be expulsion from camp and a phone call to the parent to pick up the child. In this instance the Regional staff and the local pastor will also be contacted.

VISITATION DURING CAMP:

We do not allow visitors during our camps so that the campers and staff may remain focused on the community and activities they are involved in. If, for some reason, you do need to visit please arrange it in advance with the directors of the camp. If you simply need to communicate with your camper during camp, please contact one of their camp directors and they can arrange a call or video call during an appropriate time on the camp schedule.

PHONES:

Campers are not permitted to make phone calls unless it is deemed necessary by or has been previously arranged with a director of the camp. Campers are not to bring cell phones or other communication devices. Those who travel with their cell phone to camp must check them in at registration and they will be returned at check out.

MONEY:

Campers may bring money for the offerings and items from the camp store. Discovery and Jr campers may elect to turn their money in to the directors during check-in. If this is done, the camp Directors will keep charge of this money and keep an accounting of it for the youth, and the leftover money will be returned to the youth at the end of camp. The purpose of this is to remove money from the cabins and all the problems that can come with money being lost or taken. Excessive amounts of money should not be brought to camp.

DO NOT BRING ANY OF THE FOLLOWING:

TV’s or similar items, vaping, tobacco or marijuana products of any nature, illegal drugs or alcohol, firearms, knives of any kind, fireworks, candles, matches, lighters, cell phones, laser lights or pointers, CDs; electronic games, iPods, iPad or other tablets, computers/laptops. If any of these items are desired or needed for the camp, the directors will arrange for and provide these items.



Dividends for Life!

Dear Parent/Guardian of La Foret Camper:

The program that you are registering for is to be held at La Foret Conference & Retreat Center. Our facility is licensed by the Colorado Department of Human Services. The license indicates that the program has met the required standards for the operation of a children's camp. You may ask to see a copy of the license which is posted in our office.

At La Foret we make every effort to provide a safe and healthy environment for children by meeting and exceeding the standards put in place by the State of Colorado. If you have any questions or concerns regarding our facilities, license, or your child's well being, you may contact our office at (719) 495-2743.

In order for La Foret to be in compliance with the laws of the State of Colorado concerning the care of children and youth away from the immediate supervision of their families, the following packet of paperwork must be completed for your camper to stay overnight at La Foret.

Please read carefully before signing. This document includes a release of liability and waiver of certain legal rights.

In consideration of my child's participation in camping activities sponsored by the Central Rocky Mountain Region (Disciples of Christ) and held at the La Foret Conference and Retreat Center:

Acknowledgement of Risks

- I understand that the CRMR and La Foret have taken safety precautions to reduce the risk of Covid-19 and other communicable diseases to campers or staff but that it is impossible to completely eliminate all risk of exposure to illnesses.
- I understand that there are numerous risks associated with participation in any camping activities, including such things as hiking, swimming, field games, crafts, campfires, and other camp activities, and that many, but not all, of these risks are inherent in these and other activities. These risks, which contribute to the unique character and desirability of the activities involved, may pose the possibility of severe injury, illness, or death. I further understand that most of the activities involved in the camping experience at La Foret will take place in an outdoor environment, and the Central Rocky Mountain Region (Disciples of Christ) and La Foret staff have taken all reasonable measures to insure the safety and well-being of all participants, including, but not limited to:
- insuring that all instructors for activities given at La Foret meet all the requirements (Local, State or Federal) for that position
- all volunteers at La Foret have been recommended by and approved by their local church and have passed a background check.
- all obvious and known hazards have been removed from the actual camping areas

I also understand that many of the risks inherent in the camping experience cannot be eliminated, altered, or controlled. Some, but not all, of the specific risks include:

- Weather conditions may change rapidly and unpredictably and may directly cause injury, i.e.: severe rainstorms, hailstorms, sunburn, lightning strikes, cold temperatures, or by acting on other factors, i.e.: performance of equipment may be impaired by weather conditions.
- Equipment used in activities may break, fail, or malfunction, despite reasonable maintenance and use, and may inflict injuries, even when used as intended. Persons using equipment may lose control of such equipment and cause injury to themselves and/or others.
- Most activities take place in a natural environment where unexpected, unseen, and unknown/unmarked objects and conditions create risk of injury, i.e.: falling, tripping, slipping, insect or animal contact, unstable surface conditions, falling rocks and objects, potentially harmful vegetation.
- Counselors and guides use their best judgment in determining camper's ability to participate in camp activities. However, campers may have unknown conditions which would limit their participation in certain activities or increase camper's risks of injury. **It is imperative that parents notify the event staff, in writing, of any known limitations.**
- Motor vehicle accidents, not the direct fault of La Foret or the CRMR, may occur in the course of transporting participants to and from camp.
- Some camping activities may have inherent risks, due to the nature of the camping experience, and there may be other risks which cannot be anticipated.

I acknowledge and assume the risks involved in any of these activities and for any damage, illness, injury, or death resulting from such risks, for myself and my child, with the exception of any unapproved activities I have notified the directors in writing about. There are no physical, emotional, or mental problems or limitations associated with my child's participation in camp activities, except as disclosed by me/us in writing to the Central Rocky Mountain Region (Disciples of Christ) and to the La Foret Conference and Retreat Center.

Release, Waiver of Liability, and Indemnification:

I, on behalf of myself and/or my child, absent gross negligence or willful misconduct hereby release and waive any claim of liability against the Central Rocky Mountain Region (Disciples of Christ) and the La Foret Conference and Retreat Center and its employees and agents with respect to any injury, illness, damage, or death, occurring to me or my child while he/she participates in any and all camp/retreats programs and activities.

Governing Law

I agree that this document, and all other aspects of my relationship and my child's relationship with the Central Rocky Mountain Region (Disciples of Christ) and its agents and employees, shall be governed by the laws of the State of Colorado. Further, I agree that any legal proceedings concerning such relationship shall be filed exclusively in the State of Colorado.
